**Why are we adopting a summer reading list?**

We believe that keeping students reading actively over the summer will help them be prepared for challenging and engaging texts in their upcoming school year.

**Who will participate in summer reading?**

For students entering 5<sup>th</sup>-8<sup>th</sup> grade in the 2017-2018 school year, titles will be **required** reading over the summer. Students should be prepared to discuss their summer reading selections during the first weeks of school.

For students entering 1<sup>st</sup>-4<sup>th</sup> grade in the 2017-2018 school year, titles will be **recommended** reading over the summer.

**Where can we find the required books?**

Vista has chosen books that are available from the Phoenix Public Library system ([www.phoenixpubliclibrary.org](http://www.phoenixpubliclibrary.org)). The closest branch for most Vista students is the Cesar Chavez Branch, located at 35<sup>th</sup> Ave. and Baseline.

The Cesar Chavez Branch also offers weekly storytimes for younger children, as well as activities for older children and teens throughout the summer.

**How else can I get my student interested in reading over the summer?**

The Phoenix Public Library has a great Summer Reading Program called “Every Hero Has a Story” for all ages, where students can earn incentives like Chipotle coupons and Diamondbacks Tickets for the books they read!
